Association of British Members

OF THE

RULES.

1. NAME.

The name of the Association shall be "The Association of British Members of the Swiss Alpine Club."

2. OBJECTS.

- (a) To encourage British Alpinists to support the Swiss Alpine Club in all its work, by becoming members of a section of that body.
- (b) To collect funds and present to the S.A.C. a club hut, and for such other purposes as the Association may from time to time determine.
- (c) To form a body able to present a collective opinion to the S.A.C. on any question of Alpine interest.
- (d) To promote among British members the sociability which is so conspicuous a feature of the Swiss sections, but from which we are necessarily debarred by living at a distance from the headquarters of our sections. This is done by informal Dinners, Lectures, Smoking "At Homes," and Showing Alpine Slides, on the Lantern.

8. CONSTITUTION.

(a) Officers.—President,

Vice-Presidents, Two Hon. Secretaries, Hon. Treasurer, Use Auditor, To be elected annually, in November or December Hon. Auditor,

With power to the Committee to increase the number of Officers by two if it so desires.

Members.-1. Ordinary. The qualification for ordinary membership shall be "membership of some section of the S.A.C." 2. Honorary. To be elected at the discretion of the Committee.

4. SUBSCRIPTION.

The Annual Subscription to the Association shall be 5/- per annum, payable at election. The payment of £2 2s. shall be considered as equivalent to the annual payment of 5/-.

Annual subscriptions shall be due on 1st January of each year, and any member whose subscription shall not have been paid on or before 1st April shall cease to be a member of the Association, but may be reinstated on payment of arrears, at the discretion of the Committee. Any member joining after the 1st November shall not be required to pay his subscription for the ensuing year.

5. GENERAL MEETINGS.

There shall be at least two General Meetings in the year, viz., The Annual General Meeting and a dinner in November or December, a more informal meeting in June, and such winter meetings as the Committee may think fit.

6. POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

- (a) The Committee may by a two-third majority of those present, call upon any member to resign if they consider his conduct to be incompatible with Membership of the Association, but such member shall have the right of appeal to the next general, or special general meeting, which shall have the power of confirming or annulling, by a two-third majority, the decision of the Committee.
- (b) The Committee, on the requisition of 12 members, may call, at any time, a Special General Meeting, provided that seven clear days' notice shall be given to all members of such a Special General Meeting, together with full information as to the place, time and business to be transacted.
- (c) The Committee shall have the power to submit any new proposal affecting the Association to a General or Special General Meeting of the members of the Association.

7. COMMITTEE.

The Committee shall consist of ex-officio members and ordinary members.

- (a) The Ex-officio members shall be the officers of the Association for the time being.
- (b) The ordinary members of the Committee shall be 12 in number; and shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Association; one-third of these shall retire annually and shall only be eligible for re-election after *one year has elapsed. The Committee may co-opt not more than three additional members, one of whom must retire yearly; the mode of election and the manner of

retirement to rest with the Committee. Five members shall constitute a quorum.

The Committee may suggest names for Officers and Committee, but this is not to be taken as precluding any two members from nominating candidates, whose consent, however, must be previously obtained.

At least three weeks' notice of the Annual Meeting shall be given to every member; and nominations for Officers and Committee must be sent in to the secretaries at least ten days before the Annual Meeting. In the event of more candidates being nominated than there are vacancies the election shall be by ballot.

*Year ends December 31st.

8. ACCOUNTS.

The accounts of the Association shall be audited in January and presented by the Treasurer at the next General Meeting of the Club, and shall be published with the Annual Report.

9. CASUAL VACANCIES.

The Committee shall have power to fill up casual vacancies amongst the Officers or Committee; and those chosen shall serve for the unexpired period of office to which the member whom they succeed was entitled.

10. ROOM FOR MEETINGS.

The Committee shall have power to hire premises for the purposes of the Association, and have done so at Gatti's, 436, Strand, W.C.

11. AN ANNUAL REVIEW.

The Committee shall have power to publish an Annual Review and appoint an Editor when they think the funds of the Club will permit.

12. ALTERATION OF RULES.

A General Meeting shall have power, by a majority of not less than two-thirds of the members present and voting to alter or add to the existing rules of the Club.

13. REGULATIONS.

The Committee shall have power to make such regulations, not being inconsistent with these rules, as they think to be for the well-being of the Club.

14. THE CHAIRMAN.

The Chairman whether at a General Meeting or at a Meeting of the Committee shall in case of an equality of votes have a second or casting vote.

HOW TO BELONG TO SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

Those who do not yet belong to the Swiss Alpine Club and desire to do so, can be put up at once, even if they do not wish to belong to our Association. They should write to the Treasurer, J. A. B. Bruce, Selborne Lodge, Guildford, and state whether they wish to join a French, German, or Italian speaking section. The subscription varies slightly in the various sections, e.g., in Geneva $17\frac{1}{2}$ frances a year (14/-), and 10 frances (8/-), entrance fee. The Association can arrange to pay the subscription to the S.A.C. yearly, or will supply Banker's Forms for that purpose. If 22/- (the first year's subscription and entrance fee) is sent the candidate can be elected at once. If he wishes to obtain the full advantage of membership he should also enclose a small photograph of himself, this will be endorsed by the Treasurer of the section and returned on his card of membership. If, in addition, he wishes to belong to our Association in England, the subscription is only 5/- a year, or £2 2s. for life.

The Central Committee of the Swiss Alpine Club have cordially approved of the formation of our Society and the large majority of British members have joined our Association.

ADVANTAGES OF BELONGING TO THE SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

Members of the Club obtain reductions on certain Swiss Railway (e.g., half-price on Zermatt Railway) half-price at certain Huts; a RIGHT of entry at the Club Huts, instead of being there on SUFFERANCE; a fortnightly paper and monthly magazine in a French section free; the Jahrbüch, a wellillustrated Annual, half-price 6 francs, and other advantages. In a German speaking section the Jahrbüch is compulsory and included in minimum subscription, but the Echo des Alpes is extra.

A good feeling is created amongst the Swiss when they see British climbers, who use their Huts, contributing to their support by becoming members of the S.A.C.

Club Hut Album contains pictures of all the S.A.C. Huts, and descriptions; it is issued as a supplement to Jahrbüch.

INSURANCE OF GUIDES.

The S.A.C. contributes one half the cost of insurance, if the guide pays the other half.

Several of our Committee and many of our members are serving in the army. We should be much obliged if members serving in any capacity will send us their names, so that we may have a record of those who have contributed to the defence of the nation.

THE WAR.

Spreading True Information among Swiss.

In consequence of the war the Meeting and Dinner arranged to be held at Saas Fee, on August 17th, was cancelled. The Committee decided not to hold the Annual Public Dinner in December. It was not considered necessary to postpone the Informal Monthly Dinners, which will be held as usual at our Club Room, on the 4th Wednesday in each month. In co-operation with other bodies we have arranged to spread a true statement of the causes of the war among our friends (especially those who are members of the S.A.C.) in Switzerland. It has been suggested that this might be done: (1) By members visiting Switzerland as a deputation or otherwise. (2) By writing personal letters to Swiss friends enclosing pamphlets translated into German, etc., stating our case. Any of our members who are willing to assist in this work should communicate with J. A. B. BRUCE, Selborne Lodge, Guildford, who will be glad to supply these on application. We have already received some interesting replies.

SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

We have proposed 36 new members for various sections during the year. The British Members now number about 600, of whom the large majority have been proposed through, and since joined, our Association. It is hoped several names of new candidates will be sent in next year. We have collected on behalf of most of the sections which contain British Members the Annual Subscriptions for 1914. The total sum so collected amounted to $\pounds 294: 18: 5$.

CLUB HUT "BRITANNIA."

Our model of the Club Hut "Britannia" was sent to the National Swiss Exhibition at Bern.

AROLLA GUIDE BOOK.

Mr. Walter Larden has kindly given the profits up to date, viz., $\pounds 8: r_4: 4$, to our fund for Relief of Swiss Guides, and has presented us with the stock in hand, consisting of about 150 copies, to be sold at I/- each (I/I)post free), for the same purpose. He only stipulates the sum in question shall be ear marked for the guides at Evolene who are in distress. Members will therefore help that fund by applying for copies.

MEMORIAL TO OUR LATE PRESIDENT, CLINTON DENT.

CLINTON DENT MEMORIAL.

A memorial brass, a photograph of which was included in last years report has been erected in the English Church at Zermatt. The negotiations in progress with the Geneva Section of the Swiss Alpine Club (for erecting a rough stone monument, with a bronze medallion, at the Cabane Britannia Saas Fee), were interrupted by the war, but the Swiss now ask us to proceed with the bronze and send it out to them when finished, We have put it in the hands of Whippell & Co.

"BELGIAN" AND "SWISS GUIDES'" RELIEF FUNDS.

We have decided to appeal to the Members of our Association, and *also to those who belong to kindred Societies*, to subscribe to the Belgian Relief Fund and to a Swiss Guides' Relief Fund. The former needs no words to commend its claims to those who have not already subscribed, the proceeds are sent direct to the Belgian Minister, and are devoted by him "not only to the families of those engaged in the war, but also to the civil population who have suffered." [Extract from a letter to the Association from the Belgian Minister.]

Swiss Guides' Relief Fund.

With respect to the Swiss Guides' Relief Fund, we enclose extracts from letters received :

"We thank you very much and heartily that your Association is so kind as to collect for the Swiss Guides suffering through the war...you will know that we already have a club fund for the relief of the Guides. It is our intention when you send us the amount you collect to add an amount from this fund, and after making the necessary enquiries to distribute it amongst those guides who need it most." [From Dr. Janggen, President of Swiss Alpine Club.]

- "I am so glad you have started a Guides' Relief Fund, as the stories of distress in Zermatt and other places are very sad. I heard of one woman there, the wife of a guide, who had a large family and apparently nothing, her husband had had no climbing up till the time the men were called out for service. I heard from Peter K. the other day, he says it is 'Schrecklich' at Zermatt, he is invalided out of the army with a dislocated shoulder." [From Rev. O.B.]
- "I take it that the good effect of a subscription for the Swiss Guides will be more moral than material." [From "H.W." a member of the Alpine Club.]
- "I am glad that the British Membership of S.A.C. are doing something for the unfortunate and absolutely innocent Swiss Guides undeservedly suffering for the iniquities of their German 'friends.' [From a member of the Alpine Club.]
- "I think the suggestion of helping the Swiss Guides a good one, those poor fellows have had no season at all this year, anything coming from their English friends at this time would be more than welcome." [From a Swiss member of S.A.C]

In spite of the great demands made on us all at the present time, we hope that Alpine Climbers and lovers of Switzerland, will spare something to help those with whom every year they have been so closely connected.

The Geneva Section, which now numbers 270 English members (out of a total of about 1170), has contributed $\pounds 17: 16: 5$ towards the expenses of our Club Room, so that their members in England may obtain, out of the subscription paid by them, some of the advantages which their Swiss colleagues possess, but from which we are debarred by living in England. It is hoped other Sections will do the same.

JUBILEE OF GENEVA SECTION OF THE SWISS ALPINE CLUB.

MEETINGS AND DINNERS-1914.

- Informal Dinners were held at the Club Room on January 28th, February 25th, March 25th, April 22nd, May 27th. On August 17th a General Meeting and Dinner was to have been held at Saas Fee, but was postponed on account of the war, October 28th.
- April 22nd—Informal Dinner at the Club Room, afterwards an "At Home" was held at the Adelaide Gallery, at which Alpine Slides were shown by members at the At Home. About τ50 ladies and gentlemen were present.

- June 17th—Annual Summer Dinner at the Club Rooms, several members came in after to discuss holiday plans. Lantern slides were shown after.
- The Annual Dinner in December was not held in consequence of the war.
